### **OUTREACH**

The ways and means AMTV has outreached into diverse sectors of Montgomery County to educate on the importance of and participation in public interest community media.

During the first quarter, Access Montgomery continued to participate in activities to increase awareness of the channels, training services and facilities.

### **Outreach Events**

A community event sponsored by Bethesda Community Baseball, provided Access Montgomery an outreach opportunity in July to participate in the Take Your Non-Profit out to the Ballpark. The ball game was held at the Shirley Povich Field in Bethesda. AMTV ran a marketing video in addition to distributing information about the station and its services to patrons. We explained how residents could get involved, encouraged them to watch the channels and sign up for classes.

In August, Board members, volunteers and staff had the opportunity to participate in the Agricultural Fair in Gaithersburg. For nine days, AMTV spoke to fairgoers about classes, and programs. AMTV distributed printed materials, showed video clips, and taught short classes at the "internet cafe" on how to edit with MovieMaker and submit a video to YouTube. For one day, fairgoers also had the opportunity to get a behind-the-scenes look inside of the Mobile Production Vehicle.

Access Montgomery had a booth at the annual Magical Montgomery Festival in September. Held in Silver Spring, AMTV distributed information to increase awareness about the channels and spread the word about our training services and facilities to get people involved.

### **Publicity**

Two volunteer producers received publicity about their programs in the Gazette during first quarter. The program *Sacrifice, Sacrifice, Sacrifice* received coverage in the Gazette. *Sacrifice, Sacrifice* acknowledges the sacrifices made by the troops and their families. The producer of the show is Sam Bland, a 2008 Telly Award winner.



### **Chelsea School Partnership**

AMTV met at the Chelsea School to discuss a continued partnership with Access Montgomery. The goal of this partnership is to increase Access Montgomery's pool of technical volunteers while giving media students and opportunity to improve their production skills.

#### **Intern Projects**

Access Montgomery's interns collectively shot the Take Your Non-Profit out to the Ballpark event in July. They also interviewed representatives from Montgomery County organizations that had information booths at the event. One intern produced a promo from captured footage to promote the Big Game at Povich Field. This is the second year Access Montgomery has participated in a Big Game event.

Two interns taped the Eritrean Heritage Festival held on August 6, 2008 at the Wheaton Library. The festival celebrated Eritrean music, dance, cultural displays, and food. Edited footage will be shown as a stand-alone program which will be included in the Friends of the Library program premiering in 2009.

This summer an Access Montgomery intern assisted in videotaping the Starrytelling Festival in Kensington, Maryland held July 18 – July 20. Highlights of the event will be shown on Access Montgomery Channels and other community TV stations across the country.

### **Certifications**

### PRODUCTION FACILITATION

The Production Facilitation section highlights activities and support AMTV provides in helping volunteers create their community media productions.

During first quarter, technical support was provided for 57 studio productions totaling more then 300 hours of volunteer public access production time. In addition to our regular productions, additional production services were provided to tape the County Fair Parade on Sunday, August 10<sup>th</sup>. The program was produced using the Mobile Production Vehicle (MPV), and served as a training class for Access Montgomery volunteers.

#### **Newsletter/Enews**

To keep volunteers informed and help build awareness of AMTV activities, the print edition of InFocus was released in August and the companion email newsletter Enews was released in September.

### Number of new, active and completed projects

There were a total of 13 projects started this quarter. Additionally, there were 94 active projects. Approximately half of these were field productions.



### PRODUCTION SERVICES

The Production Services section notes how AMTV has provided customize levels of enhanced support in the production of community media using professional staff.

The Montgomery County Arts and Humanities Council contacted Access Montgomery to produce a promo for the annual Magical Montgomery Festival. The promo was aired shown on the Silver Plaza video screens in Downtown Silver Spring aw well as on AMTV.

A special edition episode of Coming Attractions was produced on-location using the MPV at Montgomery College, Silver Spring/Takoma Park Campus.

In addition to Coming Attractions and 21 This Week, a 30 second PSA was produced for the Leukemia & Lymphoma Society "Light the Night Walk", a 60-second Hometown Video Winner Promo and a 30-second announcement explaining the termination of NASA TV on Access Montgomery Channels.

Access Montgomery contracted with the Montgomery County Board of Elections to produce a series of election training videos and PSA's which are listed below:

- 1) One twenty-minute Board of Election Judge training video
- 2) Two Voter PSA's (English & Spanish versions)
- 3) One Registration/Absentee PSA
- 4) One voter preparation PSA
- 5) One five-minute video, "Civic Responsibility", with open-captioning and a Spanish version

Production services were provided for one monthly production of Coming Attractions and Think Green; weekly productions of 21 This Week and Montgomery Week in Review; and County Ag Fair (Set-up, ENG, Workshop and Breakdown) and Candidate's Forum.

Post Production services were provided for "Coming Attractions", a monthly arts and entertainment show. The post-production services included editing AFI Silver Minute segments with voice-over to graphics, event calendars, bumpers and joiners, video profile and full page graphics for teases and interviews. The production services for "21 This Week", a weekly public affairs program, include graphics on the topics of discussion. "Think Green", a monthly ENG produced show, informs the community about organizations and county departments that are taking steps to be "green". Production services included graphics, event calendars, and packages edited together with interviews.

In addition, graphics were created for live-to-tape productions for access show "In Montgomery County". Opens were created for an access-user show called "Mental Health Minutes: A Dramatization" and for "Everyday People". Full-service editing was provided for productions including Board of Elections Videos, Magical Montgomery PSA, Light the Night PSA, Hometown Videos Promo, and for a League of Women Voters production.

### DISTRIBUTION

The Distribution section shares how AMTV has provided distribution of community media via AMTV19 and AMTV 21.

The new Programming Schedule Quarter began June 30th for thirteen weeks.

Several programming efforts were tied to the Montgomery County 2008 Agricultural Fair.

- Five original, volunteer produced quarter-hour programs about aspects of the Agricultural Fair were scheduled several times each on AMTV21 beginning in July.
- Public Service Announcements created specifically for the 2008 Agricultural Fair were scheduled on the channels beginning in July.
- Weekly schedule grids were printed for distribution showing specific programs on the channels listed all related programs to the Agricultural Fair.
- The volunteer-produced Montgomery County 2008 Agricultural Fair Parade and Coronation program was scheduled several times over several weeks beginning on August 13<sup>th</sup>.

In September, approved applications for channel time for series programs were received and the core schedules for AMTV 19 and 21 were formed.

### **Overall Operations**

### **Staffing**

Access Montgomery welcomed Genaye Gadarowski, Volunteer Coordinator, Shannon Romano, Administrative Assistant, and ProdOmri Haberman and Brittney Dorsey, Production Technicians. Access Montgomery said good bye to Bernard Dowell, Playback Supervisor and Brian Hatfield, Playback Operator.

Performance Awards previously approved by the Board were distributed on August 1, 2008. Twelve employees were certified in Standard First Aid and CPR on September 26, 2008 by "Enjoy CPR".

### **ACM Conference**

AMTV staff attended the Alliance for Community Media International Conference and Trade show July 9-12, 2008 in Washington, DC. Staff along with hundreds of other individuals from access centers across the country attended workshops and learned best practices from others attending the conference.

Also, Access Montgomery volunteer producers were honored with three winning entries and one honorable mention at the 2008 Hometown Video Festival, awards which recognize the achievements made by public access stations from across the country.

#### **Employee Events**

An Employee Satisfaction Survey was developed and distributed to all employees. The Personnel Committee was responsible for collection and analysis of the survey. The Employee Suggestion Box has been receiving suggestions and work continues in addressing employee suggestions by Management and the Board of Directors.

The 4<sup>th</sup> Annual Picnic and Family Fun Day were held on August 17, 2008 at Smokey Glen Farm in Gaithersburg.

#### **Equipment Update**

Photoshop, AfterEffects, Illustrator, etc. were installed on the edit booth computers, and the control room computers that will support it. A new Mac computer and RAID array for the staff editor has been received and mounted, and a quote for installation and migration of the staff editor's new Mac editing computer and raid was obtained and approved.

A new Tektronics Waveform Monitor for testing and evaluating video and audio signals arrived and has been installed. We will be learning this test gear for some time, as it is very advanced from our previous unit and includes the ability to evaluate HD signals, the only unit with that feature that we have. In addition two Ikegami Studio Quality Control Monitors arrived and were installed, this gives us Digital & HD capability at two of the four QC work stations in the control rooms.

Over the summer, staff worked with the Ross Company Representative to begin the specification process for a new digital replacement switcher for Studio B.

New Cartoni P50 Studio Pod & Sigma Head arrived to replace our smallest and most ageing Studio Camera Support. We also received a second Sigma Head for Camera 1 in Studio A.

A new Evertz System Master Clock arrived and installation has begun. This Master Clock will generate our entire current and future test and sync signals (both standard definition and high definition), as well as GPS satellite generated clock signals.

Access Montgomery has signed up to be beta testers for the (ACM) Alliance for Community Media's File Sharing Network. This has been an on going development project for the ACM, that should allow County Access Users to easily share their programs nationwide with little effort.
