OUTREACH

This section identifies the activities AMTV/MCT participated in this quarter to increase awareness of the channels, training services and facilities.

New Redesigned Website


AMTV/MCT released its newly redesigned website during the second quarter. The upgraded website is part of the promotional plan to engage volunteers, promote AMTV 19 and AMTV 21, and increase outreach. It is designed to improve the users experience and capture information about AMTV and its services. Some of the enhanced features include an interactive program guide and class schedules that updates every two hours with new information, unique landing sites for specific promotions, incorporates more web 2.0 technologies such as widgets and RSS feeds, and integrates the corporate information. Future enhancements will include web streaming and video archiving capability.

Community Events

AMTV/MCT participated in the "World of Montgomery" festival in November 2008. Held in Wheaton, this festival celebrated the diverse cultural heritages of county residents. Fifty-three individuals stopped by the booth to hear about MCT and receive information about our services, and 15 people signed up for the next Orientation class.

New Contacts

AMTV/MCT made contact with a total of 180 new people in the second quarter. Our goal is to get these people actively involved with AMTV through classes, volunteering and producing.

TRAINING

This section includes information on classes and activities regarding training at AMTV/MCT.

Telling Your Own Story

AMTV/MCT's Teaching Assistants took part in two after-school programs sponsored by the Arts and Humanities Council of Montgomery County. AALEAD and Passion for Learning partnered with MCT in training students to use video to tell their own stories. Projects include poetry, music and short dramatic presentations. Completed videos will be shown on Access Montgomery channels and other short format venues.

Civil Air Patrol Cadets

Approximately 16 students with the Civil Air Patrol have taken the Orientation and Video Basics class in preparation for the producer and field camera classes. Their goal as a team is to promote Civil Air Patrol membership and activities. Gregory Hamilton, a volunteer producer at Access Montgomery, has agreed to mentor the students and assist them with their projects.

Certifications

This quarter AMTV/MCT held one "Orientation" and one "Intro to Video Basics" workshop. Both classes were filled with their maximum enrollment of 91 for Orientation and 50 for Intro to Video Basics. This quarter, 79 people were certified in the Orientation class and 53 were certified in the Intro to Video Basics class.

Additionally, in this quarter there were two rounds of the Studio Control Room, Studio Basic and Director classes. The Director class was almost filled while both Intro to Video Basics and Control Room were completely filled. There was also a one-day equivalency class for the Chelsea School students in the studio. The Studio Certifications in the chart that follows reflects the additional people from that group. The Studio Producer class had ten registrants resulting in nine certifications.

Ten people were certified in Field Camera and 15 in the Field Editor class. The Field Producer class had seven certifications. The last class for the quarter was a Photoshop workshop which ran for two days and resulted in eight certifications.

Certifications and Classes

New certifications for the second quarter totaled 281. This number reflects total certifications, rather than individuals, since many clients obtain certifications in more than one area.

PRODUCTION FACILITATION

This section highlights the activities and support AMTV/MCT provides volunteers in creating community productions.

During the second quarter, technical support was provided for 69 Studio Productions totaling 430 hours of public access production time. This represents a 43% increase from the previous quarter.

Newsletter/E-news

In an effort to keep members and volunteers informed of AMTV events, activities and programs, the October issue of InFocus (the third of eight newsletters) as well as two Enews emails were sent to volunteers.

Creative Connection Meeting

The 'Successful Field Producing' Creative Connections meeting was held on October 27, 2008. Access Montgomery staff and volunteer producers gave technical tips on producing in the field. Sam Bland, the Telly Award Winner for 'Sacrifice, Sacrifice, Sacrifice', discussed how he used Access Montgomery training and resources to create an award winning program.

The 2008 General Election Candidate Forum

Invitations to participate in the forum were sent to all candidates whose names appeared on the ballot for public office in the elections that took place on November 4th. Unedited four-minute statements by participating candidates aired repeatedly up to the November 4th election.

Monty Awards

The 2008 Monty Awards was held on Saturday, December 6, 2008 at Access Montgomery. Approximately 60 entries were received from Access Montgomery volunteer producers in nine categories. A new Lifetime Achievement award was added this year to acknowledge a volunteer producer who has been producing a program for at least ten years. A full list of winners was posted on the website.

PRODUCTION SERVICES

This section includes information on production support of community media programs using AMTV/MCT staff.

AMTV/MCT produced 8.23 hours of community programming in the second quarter. Since the beginning of the fiscal year a total of 11.28 hours of programming have been produced.

Arts and Humanities Council Events

The Annual County Executive's Award for Excellence in the Arts and Humanities was produced as a live-to-tape program using the Mobile Production Vehicle (MVP) at the Music Center at Strathmore. The 90-minute program honored artists, educators, volunteers and funders for their support of and participation in community arts.

Think Green

Production Services were provided for a new monthly series produced by Access Montgomery called Think Green. Episode #1 was produced at various locations around the county introducing the community to several green events.

Montgomery County Board of Elections

AMTV completed the last installment of the Board of Elections contract with Access Montgomery. The "Election Judge" training tape in both English and Spanish.

Montgomery County Delegation Hearings

AMTV produced two of the county delegation Hearings, "The Priorities Hearings" on November 20th and "The County Affairs Hearing" on December 11th.

Incredi-Ball

AMTV videotaped the Arts on the Block 5th Anniversary Gala, the Incredi-ball. The ball was held at the VisArts Center in Rockville Town Center on October 11, 2008.

Friends of the Library

AMTV covered two projects for the Friends of the Library. These programs will be shown as stand-alone episodes and used as roll-in segments for the new Friends of the Library studio show, "Turning Pages." The first project featured celebrity chef, Jeff Henderson, of the Food Network. The second project was an interview and book signing with Kathleen Kennedy regarding her recent book on the mixing of church and politics. The event took place at the Strathmore.

Montgomery County Humane Society 60-second PSA

Johns Hopkins University partnered with AMTV to produce a PSA for the Montgomery County Humane Society. 'Rules to Love By: Ten Commandments for a Responsible Pet Owner' was shot on location December 30 and edited December 31, 2008. The PSA will air on AMTV and the Humane's Society's website.

Monty Awards

The Monty Awards is AMTV's annual awards program recognizing and honoring its television production volunteers. The ninety-minute program includes video clips of nominated programs as well as the awarding of trophies including a "Lifetime Achievement Award".

Other Productions

Two episodes of "Coming Attractions" (#66 & #67) were produced in October & November. Episodes included various features on arts organizations as well as individual performances.

Weekly productions of "21 This Week" continued with roundtable discussions focused on issues such as: slot machines, transportation and the national election.

DISTRIBUTION

The section provides information on the distribution of community media on AMTV19 and AMTV21.

Program schedules, instructions to Playback and program lists were prepared for each day of the quarter. These schedules are also used to provide program listings to AMTV/MCT's website and the cable company's listing services.

The new Programming Schedule Quarter began September 29 for the next thirteen weeks.

The World General Conference of the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints was carried live on AMTV19 on October 4th and 5th for eight hours of programming time.

On AMTV21 starting in October, the first episode of the AMTV series "Think Green" was aired.

Leading to the General Election in November, programs and PSA's were scheduled to air several times:

- Production of a PSA for the Montgomery County Board of Elections encouraging voter registration.
- Production of a PSA by volunteers encouraging citizens to vote in the General Election.
- A 90-minute, "Candidates' Forum Maryland 8th Congressional District".
- Candidate statements by candidates running for U.S. Congress representing districts in Montgomery County.
- Candidate statements by candidates running for the Montgomery County Board of Education.

In December, the Programming department received the channel time applicants' AMTV-approved applications for Series programs to be placed in the quarterly schedules for AMTV19 and 21 for the 13-week period beginning December 29, 2008.

ADMINISTRATIVE

This section provides information on administrative events and activities at Access Montgomery.

Accounting

Changes to the chart of accounts were made to reflect the new organizational structure for implementation in January 2009.

Human Resources

Plans for the corporate reorganization have begun. New job descriptions have been written and staff has been informed of the stages of the re-organization that will take place. The reorganization is set to be completed by January 31, 2009.

Access Montgomery welcomed Daniel Rocha, as a Teaching Assistant. Jeremy Patterson, production Coordinator and Trevor McDuffus, Production Technician resigned their positions with Access Montgomery.

Mutual of America gave a presentation to staff on investment strategies.

Licensing Agreement for Access Montgomery News Footage

AMTV drafted a licensing agreement for the use of news file footage for Wall to Wall Media, a television production company in the United Kingdom. The company intends to use the footage for a documentary they are producing on the "DC Sniper" incident.

Equipment Update

The new Hitachi studio cameras have been installed in Studio B. These cameras will operate in an analog mode until the studio B switcher is replaced with a digital unit (expected FY'09 purchase for installation in FY'10).

The new Mac computer and RAID Array for the staff editor has been installed, and all software data has been migrated over. As a temporary measure one of the editing Mac's has been installed in Control Room A to record and provide playback for motion digital media. Two additional units have been requested through County Procurement for FY'09 purchase. These will be installed in both Control Rooms A & B.

A new Ross Synergy digital replacement switcher for Studio B has been submitted to County Procurement for FY'09 purchase. This is the next step in MCT's digital transition.

The new Cartoni P50 Studio Pod & Sigma Head has been deployed to Studio A and mounted with one of the new QTV teleprompters. An additional studio pod has been submitted to County procurement for FY'09 purchase to replace our last ageing studio camera support. The unit will be housed in Studio B and is able to handle the new QTV teleprompters.

The new Evertz System Master Clock, which uses the GPS satellite network to generate very accurate clock signals, is now driving the production facility wall clocks.

The new Stanton Jimmy Jib has been undergoing some careful work in Studio A. In coordination between technical services and the training department, a training class is now being developed, to begin in early January 2009.
