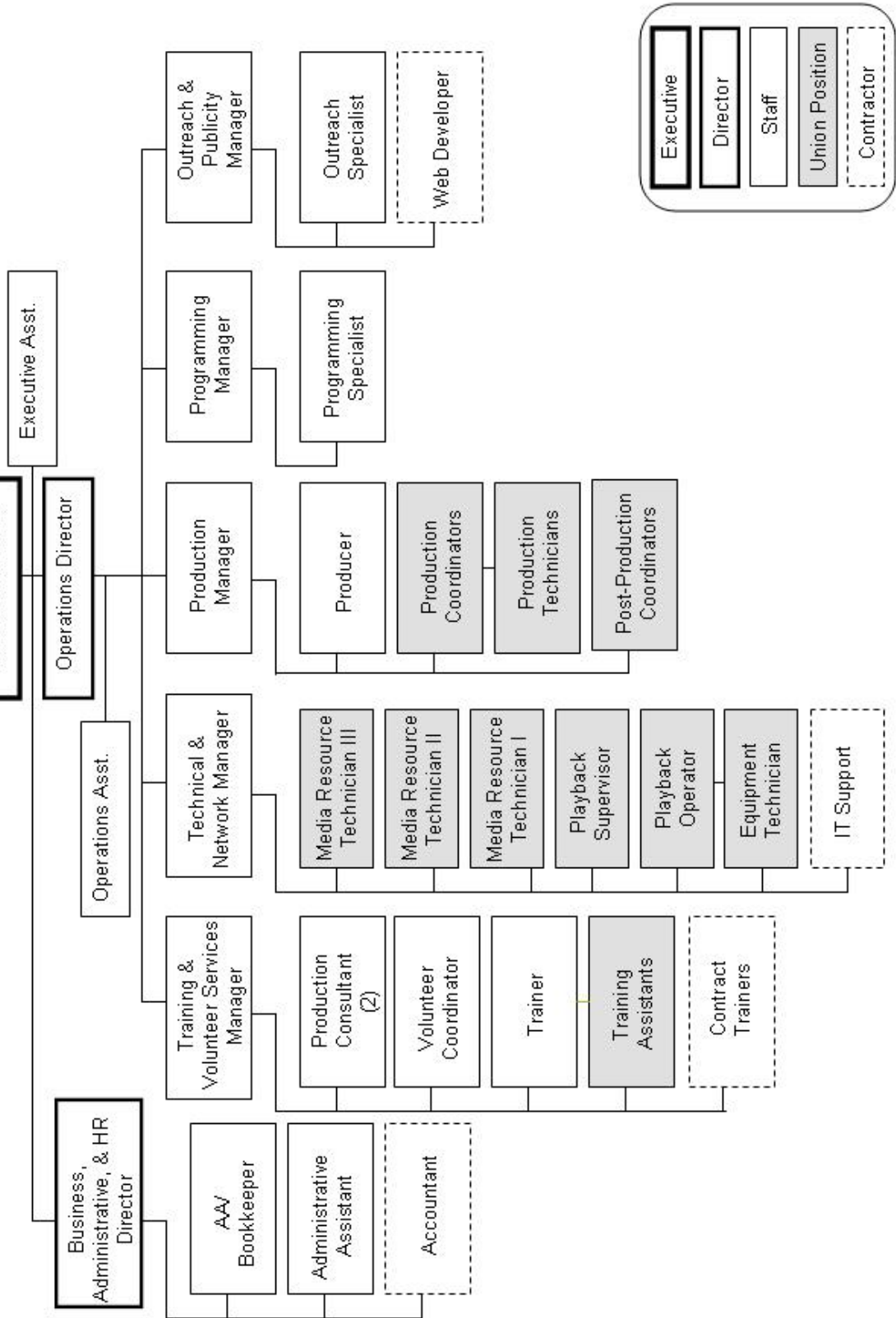

PRODUCTION SERVICES

FY10 began with the pitching and development of new program ideas to achieve 50 hours and beyond of programming. Everything from sports with a senior perspective, to healthy living and preparing youth for a global economy was included. In addition, AMTV will continue to provide coverage of some of the county's popular annual community events. Production service work for the County continues from the combined services contract.

Coming Attractions

The production of "***Coming Attractions***" continues to bring to our viewers the best in arts and arts related events in Montgomery County. The July episode was produced on location using the MPV at the Rio Center in Gaithersburg. This not only highlighted local arts organizations, but featured a live performance by award winning guitarist, Nathaniel Foley. "***Coming Attractions***" was on hiatus during August, but resumed production in September. This episode included guests from Adventure Theater, Montgomery College, Cedar Lane Stage, and the Robert Parilla Performing Arts Theater's "Rocky Horror Picture Show."

21 This Week

Production continued this quarter with five additional episodes of this weekly half-hour public affairs program.

Around the County

"Around the County" is AMTV's weekly event calendar promoting events sponsored by various Montgomery County organizations. This two minute programming event has generated an excellent response from the public.

Community Events

Access Montgomery provided videotape coverage of the following events that were held out in the community:

"Home Foreclosure Prevention Workshop" (MOCO AM/PM) - This episode of MOCO AM/PM included interviews with panelists, attendees and footage from the work shop. The panel, consisting of county housing officials along with Councilwoman Valerie Ervin, and U.S. Rep. Donna Edwards, provided important information on avoiding home foreclosure.

"Pyramid Atlantic Premiere" (MOCO AM/PM) - AMTV covered this event as an ENG. MOCO AM/PM's host Susan Labrin interviewed the evening's participants including the film maker and the silent auction participants.

"Forum on Racial Profiling" - This event was sponsored by the Montgomery County Office of Human Rights and the Montgomery County Chapter of the NAACP. The event presented an opportunity for law enforcement and community organizations to address the concerns of problems related to racial profiling. This forum was present on AMTV as a two-hour program.

"Maryland Senior Olympics" - Several ENG crews were dispersed to locations around the county to cover some of the competitions that were part of the Maryland Senior Olympics. Events included: track & field, basketball, swimming, lawn bowling and shuffle board. Coverage of these events will provide content for an upcoming one hour program.

"Hispanic Heritage Month Kick-Off" (MOCO AM/PM) - AMTV cameras were on hand to cover the start of Hispanic Heritage Month. MOCO AM/PM's host Susan Labrin interviewed event organizers along with county officials for insight on celebrating the rich Latino culture in Montgomery.

"Healthy You & Fit Kids Expo" - This event was produced on-location at City Place Mall in downtown Silver Spring. Producer/Host Oby Nwaogbe interviewed a panel of medical and nutrition experts on a variety of health issues. This multi-segment one hour program also included events from the expo such as: health screenings, exercise routines, and make-over's.

"White Flint Smart Growth Speaker Series" - This series is part of an ongoing program event focused on smart growth and its benefit to the White Flint area. This edition was hosted by Councilman Roger Berliner and included presentations by former Maryland Governor, Parris Glendening, and Bethesda businessman, John Thomas.

“Magical Montgomery” - AMTV’s coverage of this annual event included full MPV coverage from the Montgomery Traditions stage, interviews with various arts organizations, the County Executive, and person on the street perspectives. The final program will be a combination of performances, interviews and event footage presented as one two-hour program.

OUTREACH AND PUBLICITY

Peg Youth TV Production Workshop

The Outreach Department acted as the Project Managers for the PEG Youth TV Production Workshop. Outreach staff coordinated with the Montgomery County Public Schools' Administration, Teaching Staff, School Transportation, Parents and Students to facilitate the workshops. Outreach staff also acted as the liaison with AMTV's Training Department to coordinate all aspects of the students' experience at our studios. And the Outreach Department complied with county requests for specific focus group material and feedback from the students regarding their television viewing habits.

Here's a brief summary of the program:

Two Montgomery County Public Schools, Loiederman Middle School and Seneca Valley High School participated in the PEG Youth TV Production Workshop at AMTV this summer. Each school group produced a program that aired on AMTV 19 and 21, and on other PEG stations.

In early July 2009, Loiederman Middle School students participated in the first PEG Youth TV Production Workshop, which was a great success. Their programs feature segments about: Bullying, Grades, Global Warming, and Nutrition/Exercise.

During the second PEG Youth TV Production Workshop, AMTV worked with students from Seneca Valley High School. Their programs featured segments about: What's in the Teen Heart, Abuses toward Skateboarders, Football, Gay Teens, Cell Phones and a Comedy Segment on Palm Reading.

Each two-week program culminated in a premiere party at the school with the AMTV Outreach and Training Staff in attendance along with the students, parents, teachers and school administration.

The Gazette Newspapers featured the PEG Youth TV Production Workshop in a story in the July 22nd issue.

Montgomery County Agricultural Fair Promotion

AMTV had a wonderful presence at the 2009 Montgomery County Agricultural Fair including Mobile Production Van (MPV) coverage of the fair parade, an elaborate booth that was covered by many AMTV Board Members, Volunteers, and staff members. Hundreds of people stopped by the MPV and the Booth to learn more about AMTV. Numerous people entered to win the backpack and gave AMTV feedback on their favorite types of TV shows. This information is currently being analyzed by the Outreach Department. All visitors who requested information were followed up by telephone and/or e-mail the week after the fair ended.

AMTV Maryland Senior Olympics Media Sponsorship

AMTV is a media sponsor for the Maryland Senior Olympics, being held November 2009 in various locations throughout Montgomery County. This is the second year that

Montgomery County is hosting this event, and AMTV is front and center as their media sponsor with signage and literature at various Maryland Senior Olympics Events. The AMTV Production Department is working with the Senior Olympics to create a program highlighting the large variety of events held during the 2009 games, and featuring Montgomery County Senior athletes.

PR Service for Volunteers

AMTV's Outreach and Publicity Department is offering a PR Service for volunteers to help them promote their programs in the local media. This service has been promoted in the September E-Newsletter and at the September MCT Volunteer Association meeting.

AMTV Partners with the Arts & Humanities Council of Montgomery County

The AMTV Outreach and Production Departments partnered with the Arts and Humanities Council of Montgomery County's annual event, the Magical Montgomery Festival on September 26th. AMTV hosted a prominently displayed outreach booth and the AMTV logo was included on the materials at the event as a media sponsor. Many residents stopped by to learn more about our programming, TV Production Classes, and volunteering at AMTV.

AMTV InFocus Newsletter and E-Newsletters

AMTV's E-Newsletter was sent to all volunteers in early September, and the printed October INFOCUS Newsletter was sent out at the end of September. The newsletter has been on a monthly schedule since February 2009, with printed copies sent each quarter and e-newsletter sent each month in between the printed copies.

AMTV partners with Montgomery County Volunteer Center to Promote Community Service Day

AMTV will be working with the Montgomery County Volunteer Center to help promote Community Service Day on October 24, 2009. A September planning meeting was held with the Volunteer Center to seek other opportunities to continue to partner in the near future.

State Farm Grant Application

AMTV Outreach worked with the AMTV Production Department to apply for a grant from State Farm. The topic for this grant will be youth and driver safety. The grant was submitted, and if awarded will begin in February 2010.

Gazette Advertising to Promote Web Site and View It Now Launch

AMTV Outreach and Publicity Department is working on an advertising campaign utilizing the Gazette Newspapers trade, to promote the upcoming "**View It Now**" Service launch on www.accessmontgomery.tv.

AMTV will Present Media Day for Non-Profit Organizations

AMTV is in the planning and coordination stages for Media Day for Non-Profit Organizations on November 4th, 2009. The first in a series, this event will be held at AMTV, and will focus

on Building Effective Media Relationships. The event will feature a Media Relations Training Seminar for Non-Profits, led by Neil Greenberger, Legislative Information Officer for the Montgomery County Council. The Seminar will be followed by a Media Panel Discussion to give non-profits an opportunity to ask questions to a group of area media professionals from both print and broadcast media. Oby Nwaogbe of AMTV, Judy Hruz, Gazette Editor, Melvin Chase, WTOP Public Affairs Director and Lori Aratani, Washington Post Reporter, have committed to be part of the media panel at the event. We mailed the Media Day flyer to all organizations in the AMTV database, and The Volunteer Center will be sending AMTV's Non-Profit Day flyer to their database to help promote this event.

New AMTV Montgomery Video Productions Client – Immanuel's Church

AMTV Outreach and Production Departments worked cooperatively with a new client, Immanuel's Church, who have signed a production contract for \$4400 to hire AMTV to work with them on their December 2009 "Glory of Christmas" Production.

TRAINING AND VOLUNTEER SERVICES

New Programs

There were 27 new volunteer programs produced with four each in Public Affairs and Inspirational, two each in Educational, Arts, Youth, eight in Community, and one each in the Health, Ethnic, Humanities, Sports and Growth.

Summer Workshops and Programs

Training and Outreach worked together on the PEG Youth Grant conducting summer classes in Studio Production for two Montgomery County Schools, Loiederman Middle School and Seneca Valley High School. The workshops for both schools consisted of three days of instruction in the studio with the fourth day preparing for production. The time in between classes was spent at their schools preparing short programs focusing on youth interests, and activities. Both programs have been aired on AMTV channels.

Other workshops held were Introduction to *After Effects 1 and 2*, and *Motion/LiveType* combination. In August an *MPV Training* class was held for the taping of the parade at the Agricultural Fair. Training held a hands-on *Creative Lighting* class which demonstrated the use of field lights in addition to studio lighting.

Certifications

The AMTV Training Department's summer workshop's for the PEG Youth Grant resulted in 19 Studio certifications. Staff combined the *Orientation* with the *Intro to Video Basics* to streamline the workshops and enable students to register for the *Producer*, *Technician* and *Editing* classes in a timely fashion. Two of these combination classes were offered this quarter, with over 92 people attending.

Fall Classes

Studio Basic, *Studio Control Room* and *Studio Producer* classes began in September. These classes are at capacity. The *Field Producer* and *Camera* classes began the week of September 21, and are also at capacity. Staff ran an additional two Field classes for the fall session as a result of the extra Intro/Orientation workshop. The Editing classes begin in October with 26 students registered.

Completed Projects

Staff gave a presentation to MCTVA members on the tape submission process. They found it to be a helpful tool for volunteers when starting a project, and continuing through to the submission of the completed program.

Current Activities and Recognition

Planning is well underway for the volunteer recognition program better known as the "**Monty Awards**" to be held on December 5. Invitations will be mailed out the beginning of November. Over 50 entries have been received and the judging took place in October to decide on the winners.

Staff and Interns

This summer Training and Volunteer Services brought in three Interns. Two, having various levels of field production experience, worked on a program called “Youthful Knowledge.” The program focused on a young lady from Lumina Theatre in Takoma Park who serves as a mentor to children that have a budding interest in theater.

Meetings and Committees

Staff began meetings with the Board of Directors Training Committee to develop training that can be enhanced to attract and keep volunteers active after certification.

TECHNICAL AND NETWORK SERVICES

Production Facilitation

Over the quarter, Technical support was provided for monthly productions of “**Coming Attractions**” and weekly productions of “**21 This Week and Montgomery Week in Review**”, as well as various volunteer, community and client productions. This resulted in a total of 59 Studio Productions and 600 hours of public access production time.

In July, Technical staff provided support for several TV Production Workshops at AMTV, hosting students from Seneca Valley High School and Loiederman Middle School. This effort was part of the County Youth Programming Initiative.

In mid August, Technical support was provided for the County Fair parade. The program was produced using the Mobile Production Vehicle (MPV), and served as a training class for AMTV volunteers.

In addition to the normal load of productions, technical preparations for and execution of, the “**Magical Montgomery**” event took place in September using the MPV.

Technical & Network Department Projects

During the quarter, AMTV moved forward on the Granicus Web Archiving product titled “**View it Now!**” “**View it Now!**” (Video on Demand) provides a significant extension to AMTV’s capabilities allowing viewer’s access to AMTV programming with a click of their mouse. As work went on in other departments to develop and then tweak the required web pages, Technical Services has been capturing programming, while evaluating the necessary procedures to normalize the archiving process. The live stream & “**View it Now!**” services are currently available on our webpage at www.accessmontgomery.tv.

Staff restored and updated the computer networking connection to the AMTV Annex building. After nearly two decades, the equipment used to connect the Annex to the main building failed. Modern updated equipment was purchased and installed.

Staff successfully coordinated an upgrade to the company’s computer network. The upgrade installed two new servers and moved the company from Novell and GroupWise to Windows and Office 2007.

Staff attended the County’s PEG Digital Transition meeting at the Glenview Mansion in Rockville, a preliminary get together to go over and discuss the initial findings and recommendations of the County’s Digital Transition Study. Tom Robinson from CBG Communications led the group through the study and collected comments and concerns.

Contract Video Specialists Inc., a video engineering firm, visited Access Montgomery to provide troubleshooting and configuration consulting for AMTV’s new Digital Video Router. The Digital Routing System will be coming on-line during the Studio B transition to Digital in late December.

In early September, a new Mackie Audio Mixer arrived as a replacement for the aging Studio B unit. Installation of the new unit was completed and is now operational.

This year AMTV plans to continue the Studio B transition to Digital (SDI), and also continue moving to Studio-wide Digital Video Monitoring and Engineering Quality Control, as well as planning for an eventual upgrade of aging Facilities cameras and systems. In conjunction with this, staff attended two seminars on JVCs' newest camera systems, which are a modern tapeless professional camera that shoots in native High Definition (HD), and records directly to solid state media.

The New Ross "Synergy", digital switcher for Studio B arrived in the last weeks of FY'09. This updated and improved switcher is the next step in AMTV's digital transition. It will move us forward on the Virtual Studio and Virtual Set path, requested by both the Access Community and the Board of Directors. Staff is currently completing and reviewing technical requirements and engineering drawings in preparation for the switchers' December install.

To complement the upcoming new, and improved switching and chroma key capabilities in Studio B, a new "green screen", was installed. The "Uni-Cyc" by UniSet Corporation, is a modular semi-permanent "green screen" wall.

PROGRAMMING

Distribution

The Programming Department scheduled both AMTV operated cable channels (19 & 21) and did most operational activities needed to complete the Programming Quarter of June 29 through September 27. Applications and schedules were implemented for over 120 approved Series programs from Montgomery County residents and organizations. Each Series application can ask for a different program to play each week for up to 13 different programs. Also extensively scheduled were several non-series programs made by County residents and AMTV. Dozens of requests for schedule changes from Program Presenters and Members were honored.

In addition, AMTV 19 and 21 core schedules were created with series programs represented for the next Programming quarter starting September 28.

Programming also started and has continued regular, extensive scheduling of a Disclaimer Statement designed by the AMTV Board of Directors for distribution over the channels.

The Programming Department drafted the Policy statement for the AMTV service **“View It Now!”** a program On-Demand service where visitors to the AMTV website can immediately view programs chosen from a provided list.

As part of the AMTV contribution to the Agricultural Fair effort, the Programming Department created special Listings of Program Schedules for hand-outs. Also, starting weeks in advance, special Ag Fair public access programs and PSA's (public service announcements) were scheduled. A Public Access program produced after the end of the Ag Fair is showing many times.

Breaks between programs on ATMV channels were filled with video programming greatly reducing appearance of alpha/numeric bulletin board CG. In these breaks, several promotional and informational programs created by AMTV's Production Department were used effectively. Also, the hours of locally supplied video programming on the channels has been increased.

Programming created and filed with the Montgomery County Government, Master Contract required reports about the numbers of hours of programming on the AMTV operated channels.

The number of program air copies held in the Videotape Library was reduced by returning “uncalled-for” or “no-longer-requested-to-be-scheduled” program tapes and DVD's to their owners.

Programming continued the scheduling of program specific promotional spots for **“21 This Week”**, the weekly **“Event Calendars”** (with separate ones for channels 19 and 21), and several **“MOCO AM/PM”** short informational programs produced by AMTV.

Work continued in order to supply information for updating and extending the A-List Program Guide which appears on the COMCAST cable channels informing viewers of details of available programs on AMTV operated channels.
